### WHAT'S AHEAD

The Wisconsin women's soccer team heads west to California for the Stanford Tournament this weekend. The Badgers will face off against No. 12 Santa Clara and No. 3 Stanford during the tournament.

### LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ Off the head of freshman Alev Kelter, Wisconsin (4-2-1) defeated DePaul (4-2-2) Sunday afternoon in a thrilling 2-1 victory. Kelter headed two goals for the Badgers come-from-behind win, including one in the final minute and a half, to keep UW unbeaten on its home field (4-0-1).
- ▶ DePaul's goal in the 55th minute, snapped the Badgers scoreless streak at home that lasted 459 minutes. After being down, 1-0, Wisconsin answered with back-to-back goals. Each served up by Meghan Flannery, Kelter was inside the six-yard box to head the ball in for the goal.
- ▶ Wisconsin finished the game outshooting DePaul 14-7 with Kelter leading the team with five of her own. Wisconsin also held the advantage in corner kicks, 8-2. UW now has a season-total, 58 corner kicks.

### BADGER NOTES

- ▶ The Badgers remain unbeaten on their home field going 4-0-1, while only allowing one goal. As UW prepares to go on the road, they are winless when playing on the road. This poses UW's toughest stretch yet, going on the road and facing four ranked opponents in the next two weeks.
- ▶ The Badgers held teams scoreless through 327 minutes before allowing a goal since its first match of the year against No. 3 Notre Dame. The Badgers held opponents scoreless for 459 minutes at McClimon, earning four shutouts on their home field to start the season.
- ▶ Michele Dalton has made five starts for the Badgers including two shutouts, with a .762 save percentage and a 0.96 goals-against average. Lauren Gunderson is 2-0 for the Badgers making a total of four saves in two 1-0 shutout victories.
- ▶ The Badgers have had a staggering 58 corner kicks through seven games this season, including an NCAA record 23 against Green Bay. Wisconsin tallied 99 corners in 2008 and is well on its way to passing that number.
- ▶ Five of UW's seven matches have been decided by one goal, winning three and losing one by a score of 1-0. Through seven games UW has scored five goals and allowed five, however UW has outshot opponents 103-64. The Badgers highest scoring game was a 2-1 win over DePaul.

► Wisconsin's game-winning penalty kick against North Dakota State was the Badgers' first opportunity in three years. In 2006 the Badgers had a missed penalty kick, but the last time the Badgers scored on a penalty kick was on Sept. 2, 2005 against Oklahoma. Amy Vermuelen scored on the PK to give the Badgers the 2-0 advantage.

► Four different Badgers have scored for UW, with freshman Alev Kelter as the only Badger to have two goals.

► Wisconsin went 303 scoreless minutes, the longest to start a season in program history, before netting its first goal of the season in its second overtime period against Green Bay. Since its scoreless streak, the Badgers have netted at least one goal in four of its last five games.

► The Badgers have a young squad with a total of seven freshmen and sophomores in the starting lineup. Three Badger freshmen have taken a starting role for Wisconsin including, Alev Kelter, Monica Lam-Feist and Lindsey Johnson.

## SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

### No. 12 Santa Clara (3-2-0)

► No. 12 Santa Clara, who jumped into the polls this week after a successful weekend winning their own Santa Clara Classic tournament. The Broncos defeated No. 5 Notre Dame, 2-0, and No. 7 Purdue, 3-1, to claim the tourny.

► The Broncos have had seven different players score their eight goals so far this season. Senior Jordan Angeli leads the team with two of her own. Angeli was named Most Valuable Player last weekend during their tournament.

► Bianca Henninger has started all seven games for Santa Clara in goal with a record of 3-2-0 and eight saves on the season. The sophomore was named Most Valuable Goalkeeper in the Santa Clara Classic last weekend.

► Head coach Jerry Smith comes into his 23rd season coaching the Broncos. His 338-90-30 record is ranked 5 in NCAA Division history and he is the winningest women's soccer coach in Santa Clara history.

### ► No. 3 Stanford (7-0-0)

► The Cardinal have got off to a strong start with a 7-0-0 record and are No. 3 in the Sept. 15 NSCAA poll. Two of their wins were claimed last weekend in the Santa Clara Classic as they defeated No. 5 Notre Dame 2-0, and No. 7 Purdue 2-1.

► Seven different players have scored Stanford's impressive 23 goals so far this season. Senior Kelley O'Hara leads the team with eight goals and is second with three assists. O'Hara is one to watch as she is projected as the nation's top player for the third consecutive season.

► Kira Maker has been the Cardinal's starting goalkeeper with a 7-0 record. Maker has nine saves on the season and is tied for fifth in Stanford's all-time shutouts list with 16 and is second on the single season list with 14.

► Paul Ratcliffe enters his seventh season as head coach for Stanford. He has led the Cardinal to an 85-33-16 overall record with six NCAA Tournament appearances. After their 2008 season Ratcliffe was named Coach of the Year by NSCAA/Adidas, Soccerbuzz, and Soccer America along with being named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

## ABOUT THE SERIES

► The Badgers hold a 1-1-0 all-time record against Santa Clara with their last meeting in 1994 a 4-0 loss in the St. Mary's Classic. UW holds a 2-1-0 record against Stanford. It's last meeting against the Cardinal was in 2000 and resulted in a 2-0 loss for the Badgers.

## NOTEWORTHY

► To be the best, you have to play the best. The Badgers' 2009 schedule includes eight 2008 NCAA Tournament participants featuring four conference champions. The varied non-conference schedule which includes NCAA runners-up Notre Dame and College Cup participants Stanford will prepare the Badgers for a tough Big Ten Conference slate. Six of UW's opponents are ranked in the NSCAA preseason top 25.

► The Badgers were picked to finish seventh in the Big Ten preseason coaches' poll. This is Wisconsin's highest appearance since Wilkins took over as head coach in 2007. Penn State was picked as the preseason favorite for the seventh-consecutive year with Michigan State and Illinois closing out the top three spots.

► The Badgers' 29-player roster returns 17 letterwinners, including eight starters from the 2008 squad. Leading the Badger attack, Laurie Nosbusch returns as the leading scorer and team MVP from a year ago. Nosbusch and sophomore Erin Jacobsen will pick up where they left off, returning as Big Ten All-Freshman Team honorees.

► The UW will be led by captains Krista Liskevych and Taryn Francel. Liskevych, a senior midfielder out of Encinitas, Calif., and Francel a junior out of San Diego, Calif., are in their first season as captains.

► With a new era brings new talent. Wilkins welcomes 12 newcomers, one goalkeeper, six midfielders, three defenders and two forwards.

## HEAD COACH PAULA WILKINS

Paula Wilkins enters her third season with the Wisconsin women's soccer program. In only two seasons Wilkins has already made giant leaps in rebuilding the program. In her second season, UW finished with a 9-9-1 record finishing the season at .500, and narrowly missed a berth into the Big Ten Tournament. In her first season Wilkins led the Badgers to a 6-11-1 record, marking a three-game improvement overall and a one-game improvement in the Big Ten from 2007 to 2008.

Following the conclusion of her first season Wilkins scored one of the top recruiting classes for 2008, ranking 21st in the nation and marking the highest ranking in UW history. In her first recruiting class, two were named to the 2008 Big Ten All-Freshman Team, Laurie Nosbusch and Erin Jacobsen.

Wilkins has compiled a remarkable 134-39-13 (.755) record, the eighth-highest winning percentage in the nation among active NCAA coaches, in her eight seasons as a head coach. Prior to her start at Wisconsin, Wilkins was the head coach at Penn State for six years. The Nittany Lions earned six NCAA tournament berths, which included two College Cup appearances during her tenure. In addition, Penn State won six Big Ten regular season championships, along with a pair of Big Ten tournament titles.

Wilkins coached nine All-Americans at Penn State, including four-time All-American Christie Welsh, the 2001 player of the year and winner of the prestigious M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Wilkins also recruited and guided Tiffany Weimer, a three-time All-American, two-time Big Ten offensive player of the year and the conference's record holder in career goals.

Wilkins earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from UMass in 1994 and was a CoSIDA Academic All-American. Wilkins was inducted into the UMass Hall of Fame in 2009. She later received her master's degree in physiology from Penn State. A native of Middletown, Pa., Wilkins was an NSCAA youth All-American at Middletown Area High School. She also played on a national Olympic Development Program team.
